The Open Cyprus Coalition celebrates World Press Freedom Day.

The Open Cyprus Coalition is marking World Press Freedom Day, 3 May 2010, by renewing its call for full recognition of the right of access to information in Cyprus.

Established by UN in 1993, World Press Freedom Day is this year dedicated to the Right to Know – the right of all, including journalists, to have access to information held by government and other public bodies.

According to the UNESCO the Right to Know is an essential part of freedom of expression and freedom of the media. It has been recognised as a fundamental human right at the international level but is still not fully respected in law or in practice in Cyprus.

The Open Cyprus Coalition is a bi-communal initiative to promote the right to access information held by public bodies. Journalists are invited to join and support the Coalition.

"Press freedom guarantees and access to information mechanisms should become a priority for all democratic institutions in Cyprus," said xxx, xxx of KAB.

"Democratic participation and government transparency depend on people who are well informed", said xxx, xxx of IKME.

The Open Cyprus Coalition will be carrying out legal analysis, training for civil society, and monitoring of current levels of transparency. It will hold public consultations on recommendations for advancing the right to know in Cyprus. It is currently formed of the Cyprus EU Association (Kıbrıs AB Derneği, KAB), the Sociopolitical Studies Institute (Ἰδρυμα Κοινωνικοπολιτικών Μελετών, ΙΚΜΕ) and Access-Info Europe.

"Journalists play an important role in ensuring the right of the wider public to engage in public debate in an informed manner. Public bodies should therefore respond fully to journalists' requests for information", said xxx, xxx of Access-Info Europe.

The Open Cyprus Coalition would like to direct journalists and all citizens to the website <u>accessinfocyprus.eu</u> where various resources, toolkits and guidelines can be found and they can sign up to join the Coalition.
